On Thursday we celebrated the Ascension of Jesus; on Sunday next (8th June) we **GOSPEL REFLECTION** will celebrate Pentecost. In the meantime, we listen to the words of Jesus to his disciples at the last supper, words of invitation and a message of peace. Indeed, this weekend it is the prayer of Jesus to his Father for us - those who believe and those who will come to believe through our witness. Jesus prays to the Father, "That the world may believe..." And he chooses to reach others through us—through you, through me. Not with noise, not with big gestures, but through lives that shine with kindness, sincerity, and love. We evangelise through the small things: being honest, helping someone who is tired, and forgiving those who wrong us, choosing the generous option. That is how the Gospel is preached today: by a life that reflects love. And Jesus also prayed for unity. Unity in families, in communities, in the Church. How many hearts are broken by gossip, how many communities weakened by distrust and unknowing. At Mass on the Feast of the Ascension we heard in the Gospel that "rose from the dead that repentance for the forgiveness of sin should be preached to the whole world". Jesus did not give up on His apostles—he walked patiently with each of them. Let us do the same. In a world full of noise, be someone who listens. In a Church full of frailty, be someone who unites. And finally, remember that he is with us: "that I may be in them," Jesus says. He wants to live in us and he finished his ministry as it has always been: the invitation to "Follow me". Whatever is going on in our lives, let us remember: there is a God who walks with you. And never forget: the world will believe not because we are perfect, but because we love, we love just as Jesus has loved us. So walk forward with joy, with courage, and with love.
